Your Care Data!



Information about you and the care *you* receive is shared, in a secure system, by healthcare staff to support your treatment and care.

It is important that we, the NHS, can use this information to plan and improve services for all patients. We would like to link information from all the different places where you receive care, such as your GP, hospital and community service, to help us provide a full picture.

This will allow us to compare the care you received in one area against the care you received in another, so we can see what has worked best.

Information such as your postcode and NHS number, but not your name, will be used to link your records in a secure system, so your identity is protected.

You have a choice. If you are happy for your information to be used in this way you do not have to do anything. If you wish to prevent this from happening, please ask reception for an Opt Out form.

Accountable GP

From April 2015 the NHS requires that every patient registered with a Practice must have an accountable GP who is responsible for overseeing their care.

If you would like to know who your named GP is, please just ask us.

Do you suffer from Hay fever?

Hay fever is a common allergic condition that affects up to one in five people. Symptoms of hay fever include sneezing, a runny nose and itchy eyes. Even though your hay fever symptoms may be mild, they can interfere with your sleep and your daily activities at school or work.

When to seek medical advice?

Before going to see your GP, you could visit your pharmacist as they can advise you on treatment as most cases of hay fever can be treated with over-the-counter medications, such as antihistamines. You usually only need to see your GP if you can't control your symptoms with over-the-counter medications, or if you have any troublesome side effects. If you're experiencing persistent complications of hay fever, such as worsening of asthma or repeated episodes of sinusitis. Make an appointment to see your GP if your symptoms don't improve after using antihistamines.
